



What Shouldn't I Flush Down My Toilet?

We strongly recommend only flushing human waste and toilet paper down the toilet. All other items should be disposed of in the trash. Below are examples of items that contribute to drain stoppages.

Dental floss

Cat litter (including "flushable" varieties)

Hair

Kleenex (they're not designed to break down when wet)

Cigarette butts

Cotton swabs / Q-tips

Feminine hygiene products (including "flushable" varieties)

Condoms

Paper towels (they're not designed to break down when wet)

Static cling sheets

Disposable diapers (including "flushable" varieties)

Disposable wipes (including "flushable" varieties)

Bobby pins

Rags of any sort

Plastic bags of any sort

Children's toys like Hotwheel cars or other small toys that will fit in the palm of your hand. Children often toss things into the toilet. Do not attempt to flush them through the drain - do attempt to retrieve them.

Too much paper (we recommend single ply, some drains just can't handle the two, three & four ply toilet paper on the market)

Per the EPA - Do not flush old/expired medications down the toilet. They have found that trace amounts of pharmaceuticals are showing up in many cities' water supplies as a result of people doing this.

The Federal prescription drug disposal guidelines urge Americans to:

- Take unused, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs out of their original containers
- Mix the prescription drugs with an undesirable substance, like used coffee grounds or kitty litter, and put them in impermeable, nondescript containers, such as empty cans or sealable bags, further ensuring that the drugs are not diverted or accidentally ingested by children or pets
- Throw these containers in the trash
